### Battles in the Bay Part One: The Musket Wars

The introduction and trade in muskets meant an initial imbalance of power between iwi which left many vulnerable to invasion, setting the scene for the Treaty and New Zealand Land Wars. Our programme looks at what occurred for Ngāti Kahungunu and the counter-strategies that they used to retain rangatiratanga over the whenua. We will explore local rangatira and significant sites, observe traditional weapons from our collection, visit the Kuru Taonga exhibition, and finish with a model-building activity.

### Napier Cemetery Walk and Talk

Take a journey of discovery through Hawke's Bay's past with a guided walk through this historic cemetery. You will hear gripping stories of the eventful lives and deaths of local people, touching on missionary work, the New Zealand wars, maritime disasters, the coming of the railways, 19th century burial practices and headstone symbols. This programme is ideal for all schools exploring local history.

### Napier Port: Interdependence of Sectors

Using Napier Port as a case study for Economics AS 90988, we explore the role of our port as a firm with interdependence on other sectors. This programme has a session on the history of Napier's port in the MTG classroom and an optional visit to Bluff Hill lookout to see the modern port in action and meet port staff. An assessment task will be provided to support the trip and standard.

### Hangarau me te Māori: Māori and Technology

Felling a tree to carve a waka. Navigating the seas using the stars. Māori have always been able to apply their skills and knowledge to develop tools in a new environment. How have these tools adapted over time? Why? In this workshop, students will discover a range of early Māori tools before having a go at using a range of old and new technologies. This session will finish with a visit to our Māori gallery - Kuru Taonga.

### Our Culture through Sculpture

**FREE - Self Guided**

This self-guided tour offers you an insight into a variety of iconic artworks that make Ahuriri (Napier) unique, from the well-known Pania of the Reef statue to a Lauris Edmond poem etched into the back of a building. Starting at the museum, collect maps and booklets containing historic images from MTG's archives to guide your groups on their way. This self-guided experience is free, but bookings are essential.

### Kuru Taonga - Māori Art

We will visit our new exhibition which shows the history of people and places of Ngāti Kahungunu, telling the stories of their time and the events that shaped Te Matau-a-Māui into the region of Hawke's Bay. Uncover the story of Karaitiana Takamoana's carved meeting house, Te Whare ō Heretaunga - now scattered around the world. View the last remaining panel at MTG. Learn about the elements of Māori design and pattern through the creation of your own panel in remembrance of your tipuna (ancestor).

### Quake '31

Use our 1931 Earthquake exhibition and presentation to do research for NCEA Geography/History/Art History/Design and inspire creativity in the Arts. Depending on your focus and the time available, we offer a choice of activities after the main programme and exhibition visit. For example a class survival game on the interactive board, a short walk around MTG Hawke's Bay to see sites discussed in the programme, or exploration of Art Deco design.

### Junior Curator

Have you ever wondered how a museum exhibit is put together? Who decides what will be included, where it will be placed and how it will be presented? What are the key aspects used when designing an exhibit? Become an exhibit designer. You will be given the exhibit brief, the floor plan and the associated artifacts (items). Create a visual or multi-sensory experience for future guests to enjoy.

### Mataruahou Hikoi

Mataruahou is the original name for Scinde Island, or the Napier Hill. On this hikoi, students will explore the local history of Te Matau a Maui (Hawke's Bay) while taking a walk up to the Bluff Hill Lookout. Taking in the views, the guide book will assist with locating significant pā sites, landmarks and other geographical features, discovering the stories and events that took place in these areas.

**Duration:** 2 hours  
**Venue:** Begin at MTG Hawke's Bay, walking up to Bluff Hill Lookout  
**Learning Areas:** Social Sciences, Local History



### Seawall Murals Walk and Talk

The guided walk takes you around a sample of inner city seawall murals discussing artists' intentions, techniques, considerations, and the project. It supports the Art Curriculum for secondary schools but can also be a stimulus for creative writing, conservation studies and Social Science 'protest' studies.

### Out and About on Marine Parade

**FREE - Self Guided**

Explore extraordinary changes to Marine Parade over the last 150 years. Who were the Clive flood heroes? How did a 200-year-old cannon end up here? Starting at the museum, collect maps and booklets containing historic images from MTG's archives to guide your groups on their way. Students are given high vis vests and in adult-led groups explore all the interesting monuments, memorials and structures along Marine Parade.

### Historic Heretaunga Hikoi

**FREE - Self Guided**

Head off on a hikoi around Heretaunga (Hastings) and discover what was there before. When were these buildings built? What was the 'Battle of Hastings'? And what are the names of those sheep?! Starting at Civic Square, students work in groups to follow maps and booklets containing historic images from MTG's archives. Students work in adult-led groups to explore the interesting monuments, memorials and structures around the Hastings CBD.

**Duration:** Spend 1-2 hours  
**Venue:** Start at Civic Square, Hastings  
**Learning Areas:** Social Sciences, Local History
