Battles in the Bay

Part 1 The Musket Wars: Considers the impact of European trade in Aotearoa during the early 19th Century; particularly on hapu living in Te Matau-a-Maui/Hawke's Bay. Ākonga will visit the exhibition Kuru Taonga to gather stories of key rangatira and create a model fortified pā.

Part 2 Conflict at Ōmarunui: We take a close look at the relationship between local Rangatira and settler militia during the Hauhau conflicts in Pētane and Ōmarunui. Students visit the exhibition Kuru Taonga to view primary source artefacts, then design and print peace flags using symbols from traditional and/or modern times.

Kuru Taonga / Māori Art

Discover the fate of Ngāti Kahungunu rangatira Karaitiana Takamoana's carved meeting house - the most scattered in the world. View the only two panels returned to Te Matau-a-Maui/Hawke's Bay. Ākonga learn about repatriation, and the elements of Māori design of iwi around the motu, then create a pou/panel in remembrance of their tīpuna/ancestors.

Napier Cemetery Walk and Talk

Whether they died protecting whanau, skylarking about or displaying feats of great courage, how people died in the past can tell us a lot about how they lived. Join our educators on a tour of the historic Napier Cemetery and learn about the Treaty of Waitangi, New Zealand Wars, maritime disasters, the coming of the railways as well as 19th Century burial practices. Perfect for local or visiting school groups, we might even have a good ghost story to tell.

Waka huia

From one large treasure box to many small ones, ākonga get a close up look at traditional waka huia, treasure boxes and hue/gourd containers from the MTG collection. They will learn about the cultural significance of waka huia and the elements of design used to decorate them. A visit to the exhibition *Kuru Taonga* will showcase local and contemporary Māori artists' work. These experiences will be used to develop a visual diary and facilitate students art making.

Hangarau me te Māori: Māori and Technology

Felling a tree to carve a waka. Navigating the seas using the stars. Māori have always been able to apply their skills and knowledge to develop tools in a new environment. How have these tools adapted over time? Why? In this workshop, students will discover a range of early Māori tools before having a go at using a range of old and new technologies. This session will finish with a visit to our Māori gallery - Kuru Taonga.

Our Culture through Sculpture

FREE - Self Guided

This self-guided tour offers you an insight into a variety of iconic artworks that make Ahuriri (Napier) unique, from the well-known Pania of the Reef statue to a Lauris Edmond poem etched into the back of a building. Starting at the museum, collect maps and booklets containing historic images from MTG's archives to guide your groups on their way. This self-guided experience is free, but bookings are essential.

Te Wā o ngā Tohorā/The time of the Whales (NEW!)

An introduction to the way Māori and Pākehā lived and worked together in the early whaling days, and their connection to the natural world. The story of the Tohorā/whales of Te Matau-a-Maui/Hawke's Bay is told through primary source collection images and artefacts, a museum search, and activities such as replica scrimshaw designing and printmaking, heru/comb making and satellite whale-tracking. Candle-making demonstration included.

Quake '31

Use our 1931 Earthquake exhibition and presentation to do research for NCEA Geography/History/Art History/Design and inspire creativity in the Arts. Depending on your focus and the time available, we offer a choice of activities after the main programme and exhibition visit. This concludes with a short walk around MTG Hawke's Bay to see sites discussed in the programme, or exploration of Art Deco design.

Marineland: Animals as Entertainment?

Opened in 1965, Marineland became an iconic tourist attraction for Napier. Why then did Marineland's popularity as an attraction wane and lead to its eventual closure? Ākonga will visit Silver Shadows – The Story of Marineland exhibition and understand how societies values and attitudes to keeping cetaceans in captivity have changed. They will analyse the perspectives of animal trainers, tourists, protestors and the economic impacts, to form arguments. Using greenscreen technology students will present their own ideas in a classroom debate.

The Great Ahuriri Escape

Puzzling, energetic and entertaining! Wake up your students' grey matter by completing the Great Ahuriri Escape. Escape your way out of Hawke's Bays biggest treasure vault (the MTG!) by learning stories behind the different names of some of our local landscape features like Bluff Hill, Karetoki Whare, and West Quay. We'll give you a few clues and then it's all about teamwork, problem-solving and a souvenir photo upon completion for your efforts.

Seawall Murals Walk and Talk

The guided walk takes you around a sample of inner city seawall murals discussing artists' intentions, techniques, considerations, and the project. It supports the Art Curriculum for secondary schools but can also be a stimulus for creative writing, conservation studies and Social Science 'protest' studies.

Mataruahou Hikoi

Mataruahou is the original name for Scinde Island, or the Napier Hill. On this hikoi, students will explore the local history of Te Matau a Māui (Hawke's Bay) while taking a walk up to the Bluff Hill Lookout. Taking in the views, the guide book will assist with locating significant pā sites, landmarks and other geographical features, discovering the stories and events that took place in these areas.

Historic Heretaunga Hikoi

FREE - Self Guided

Head off on a hikoi around Heretaunga (Hastings) and discover what was there before. When were these buildings built? What was the 'Battle of Hastings'? And what are the names of those sheep?! Starting at Civic Square, students work in groups to follow maps and booklets containing historic images from MTG's archives. Students work in adult-led groups to explore the interesting monuments, memorials and structures around the Hastings CBD.

Out and About on Marine Parade

FREE - Self Guided

Explore the extraordinary changes to Napier's Marine Parade over the last 150 years. Who were the heroes of the Clive flood? How did a 200 year old cannon end up here? Starting at the MTG, collect maps and booklets containing historic images from the museum archives to guide your groups on their way. Students are given hi-vis vests and in adult led groups explore all the interesting monuments, memorials and structures along Marine Parade.
