Historic Heretaunga Hiko

FREE - Self Guided

Head off on a hiko around Heretaunga (Hastings) and discover what was there before. When were these buildings built? What was the 'Battle of Hastings'? And what are the names of those sheep?! Starting at Civic Square, students work in groups to follow maps and booklets containing historic images from MTG's archives. Students work in adult-led groups to explore the interesting monuments, memorials and structures around the Hastings CBD.

Out and About on Marine Parade

FREE - Self Guided

Explore the extraordinary changes to Napier's Marine Parade over the last 150 years. Who were the heroes of the Clive flood? How did a 200 year old cannon end up here? Starting at the MTG, collect maps and booklets containing historic images from the museum archives to guide your groups on their way. Students are given hi-vis vests and in adult led groups explore all the interesting monuments, memorials and structures along Marine Parade.

Waka huia

From one large treasure box to many small ones, ākonga get a close up look at traditional waka huia, treasure boxes and hue/gourd containers from the MTG collection. They will learn about the cultural significance of waka huia and the elements of design used to decorate them. A visit to the exhibition *Kuru Taonga* will showcase local and contemporary Māori artists' work. These experiences will be used to develop a visual diary and facilitate students art making.

Quake '31: Life at the Boundary.

In this programme students will explore life at the boundary in Te Matau-a-Māui/Hawke's Bay. Using case studies from around the region, students will demonstrate their understanding of the impacts of the 1931 earthquake as part of a bigger geological picture of the region over time. Students will explore the Earthquake exhibition at the museum considering primary source evidence as part of the collective narrative about the 1931 earthquake; and the kotahitanga or collective action it took to rebuild communities and infrastructure.

Battles in the Bay

Part 1: The Musket Wars: Explores the impact of European trade and technology in Aotearoa during the early nineteenth century. Students will begin to understand how the "Potato Wars" broke tapu for many iwi in that war was no longer a seasonal activity and further that the acquisition of muskets led to the biggest loss of life for any wars that Aotearoa/ New Zealand has participated in to date. How local hapu living in Matau-a-Maui/Hawke's Bay were impacted and their relationship with the crown is also outlined. The *Kuru Taonga* and new *The Light Shone Clear* exhibitions will be visited as part of this programme. An additional workshop creating fortified model pā is available as time permits.

The Great Ahuriri Escape

Puzzling, energetic and entertaining! Wake up your students' grey matter by completing the Great Ahuriri Escape. Escape your way out of Hawke's Bays biggest treasure vault (the MTG!) by learning stories behind the different names of some of our local landscape features like Bluff Hill, Karetoki Whare, and West Quay. We'll give you a few clues and then it's all about teamwork, problem-solving and a souvenir photo upon completion for your efforts.

Mataruahou Guided Walk.

On this guided walk of Mataruahou/Napier Hill students will learn the local pūrākau or stories behind one of Napier's most identifiable landmarks. By identifying original place names, we acknowledge the mana of original tangata whenua of Ahuriri, their pā, sacred sites and survival using traditional natural resources. Looking out to Whanganui a Orotū, students will explore the human and geological changes of this area and the impacts to this day.

Please note: a reasonable level of fitness is required for this hikoī, some areas are steep and inaccessible by car. Please contact us so that we can discuss your accessibility requirements.

Pūrākau o Te Whenua

NEW: Book now!

Discover some of the stories behind Te Matau-a-Maui/Hawke's Bay and improve your students' knowledge of Te Reo, mātauranga Māori and Aotearoa/New Zealand histories in this new programme. Students will learn about local landscapes and geographical features and how they were named by both the tangata whenua and early European explorers of Aotearoa/New Zealand. Students will also have an opportunity to visit two exhibitions: *Kuru Taonga* and *Pūrākau o te Whenua* to connect with taonga (objects and treasures) used in everyday life to further connect them to the stories of our place.

Kuru Taonga / Māori Art

Discover the fate of Ngāti Kahungunu rangatira Karaitiana Takamoana's carved meeting house - the most scattered in the world. View the only two panels returned to Te Matau-a-Maui/Hawke's Bay. Ākonga learn about repatriation, and the elements of Māori design of iwi around the motu, then create a pou panel in remembrance of their tīpuna/ancestors.

Battles in the Bay

Part 2: The Conflict at Ōmarunui: Examines the relationship between local rangatira and settler militia during the Hauhau conflicts in Pētane and Ōmarunui. Students will visit both the *Kuru Taonga* and *The Light Shone Clear* exhibitions and will view and explore how to use primary source artefacts for their own research purposes. An additional workshop creating peace flags in the style of Te Kooti's flags is available as time permits.
