Out and About on Marine Parade

FREE - Self Guided

Explore extraordinary changes to Marine Parade over the last 150 years. Who were the Clive flood heroes? How did a 200-year-old cannon end up here? Starting at the museum, collect maps and booklets containing historic images from MTG's archives to guide your groups on their way. Students are given hi-vis vests and in adult-led groups explore all the interesting monuments, memorials and structures along Marine Parade.

Heretaunga Historic Hiko

FREE - Self Guided

Head off on a hiko around Heretaunga Hastings and discover things you might not have known existed. When were these buildings built and what were they used for? What was the "Battle of Hastings" and what's up with those sheep?! Starting at the beautiful Civic Square, ākonga collaborate in supervised teams, using booklets provided, to explore the CBD. Maybe your kaiako can give some prizes for a job well done!

Mataruahou Guided Walk.

On this guided walk of Mataruahou/Napier Hill students will learn the local pūrākau or stories behind one of Napier's most identifiable landmarks. By identifying original place names, we acknowledge the mana of original tangata whenua of Ahuriri, their pā, sacred sites and survival using traditional natural resources. Looking out to Whanganui a Orotū, students will explore the human and geological changes of this area and the impacts to this day.

Please note: a reasonable level of fitness is required for this hiko, some areas are steep and inaccessible by car. Please contact us so that we can discuss your accessibility requirements.

Dates: term 1 and 4

Duration: 2 hours

Venue: begins and concludes at the MTG Hawke's Bay. Walk up to the Mataruahou public lookout

How was Pania reef formed and who were Karetoki and Moremore? How do their stories remind us today to be good kaitiaki of our environment? As part of this session we will visit the Pania statue and view examples of taonga spoken about in this famous pūrākau. Explore important local pūrākau through exhibits, storytelling, and creative activities designed to inspire connection to our local environment and tangata whenua.

Hangarau me te Māori: Māori and Technology

Felling a tree to carve a waka. Navigating the seas using the stars. Māori have always been able to apply their skills and knowledge to develop tools in a new environment. How have these tools adapted over time? Why? In this workshop, students will discover a range of early Māori tools before having a go at using a range of old and new technologies. This session will finish with a visit to our Māori gallery - Kuru Taonga.

Māori Migration to Aotearoa

Where did Māori come from? How did they travel to Aotearoa? During this session children will learn about early Māori arrival to Aotearoa 700 years ago. During this lesson we will visit the Kuru Taonga exhibition, then return to the classroom for a range of activities. These include making a mini model waka, tying lashings, compass-making and navigating, and satellite bird tracking.

Quake '31: Breaking News!

Travel back in time to arrive in Te Matau-a-Maui/Hawke's Bay moments before the 1931 earthquake. Team up to report live from the scene as the disaster unfolds. Using green screen technology and drawing on images and stories in the museum's earthquake exhibition and archives, students research details of what happened on the day and collaborate creatively to record eye witness accounts that can be edited into a full TV news report.

Matariki

Terms 2 and 3 Only!

Tamariki are invited to come and experience the magic of Matariki as the MTG education room is transformed into a whare tapere or house of fun! Ākonga will watch a shadow puppet show and listen to a local Matariki pūrākau. They will also participate in a range of tākarō (games) and other hands-on creative activities. To finish this programme tamariki will visit the Kuru Taonga and Pūrākau o te Whenua exhibitions, for a treasure hunt and take a special Matariki puka ngohe back to school afterwards.

Te Wā o ngā Tohorā/ The time of the Whales

An introduction to the way Māori and Pākehā lived and worked together, and their connection to the natural world. The story of the tohorā/whales of Te Matau-a-Maui/Hawke's Bay is told through primary source collection images and artefacts, a museum search, and activities such as replica scrimshaw designing and printmaking, heru/comb making and satellite whale-tracking.
