Napier Cemetery Walk and Talk

Take a journey of discovery through Hawke's Bay's past with a guided walk through this historic cemetery. You will hear gripping stories of the eventful lives and deaths of local people, touching on missionary work, the New Zealand wars, maritime disasters, the coming of the railways, 19th century burial practices and headstone symbols. This programme is ideal for all schools exploring local history. We also recommend it for schools visiting Napier on school camp.

Napier Port: Interdependence of Sectors

Using Napier Port as a case study for Economics AS 90988, we explore the role of our port as a firm with interdependence on other sectors. This programme has a session on the history of Napier's port in the MTG classroom and an optional visit to Bluff Hill lookout to see the modern port in action. An assessment task will be provided to support the trip and standard.

Seawall Murals Walk and Talk

The guided walk takes you around a sample of inner city seawall murals discussing artists' intentions, techniques, considerations, and the project. It supports the art curriculum for secondary schools but can also be a stimulus for creative writing, for conservation studies, and social science 'protest' studies.

The House of Webb - the story of English migrants to Hawke's Bay in the 1800s.

Learn the enormous challenges the Webb family faced while exploring their letters, diaries, and sketches. Appreciate the impact of European settlement on the Seventy Mile Bush surrounding their new home in Ormondville and see items they collected during their lifetime.

George Nuku: Bottled Ocean 2118 - until March 8

George, an international Māori artist who lives in Europe, is deeply concerned by the ongoing pollution of our oceans. He has turned this pollutant (recycled plastic bottles) into an installation of great beauty. Students will make their own artwork from recycled materials after seeing George's creations and learning about his themes.

The Architectural Legacy of J.A. Louis Hay - The Man and His Work

Learn about Louis Hay, an architect who left his mark on the post-1931 earthquake ravaged Napier, leaving a legacy of beautiful buildings. Who was this man? What is his style and who were his influences? Which of his grand designs made it into reality? The exhibition visit is followed by a tour of some of Hay's buildings close by MTG Hawke's Bay.

Te Tiriti o Waitangi - the living Treaty

A focus on the Treaty of Waitangi as a living document fundamental to the understanding of New Zealand's history. The Octagon display cases will provide insights into aspects of the Treaty which will provide background and a basis for discussion for students.
